- Making sure our school is full and a popular choice for local families


We will have **two elected parent/carer governor vacancies** coming up later this term and we will update you on how you can find out more and get involved!

If current parents/carers could spare 9 – 11am on the Open Morning on 19th November to lead tours we would be really grateful – please contact the office – we will give you all the information you need!






In assembly this week
