This year's British Science Week was an exciting journey of exploration and discovery for Churchfields! We embraced the theme of 'Change and Adapt', engaging in hands-on activities and drama-based workshops that allowed us to step into the shoes of historic scientists who changed the course of science forever.

Science Week Highlights:

- Early Years, Year 1, Year 2 and the ARC: These young scientists had a blast exploring colour change by creating their very own colour-changing sensory bottles. It was a fun and interactive way to see science in action!
- Years 3 and 4: Our creative minds worked hard to design and make a material that could change state, exploring how substances can have both solid and liquid properties. They were amazed by the transformation!
- Years 5 and 6: Our oldest scientists got hands-on with chemistry, identifying the pH of various liquids using colour-changing indicators. It was an eye-opening experience to see how science can help us understand the world around us.
