Dear Churchfields Families,

As you can see from the dates above, Summer 2 is a very busy term as we finish up this academic year and prepare for the next. I can already share with you some improvements that are coming from September 2025.

Miss Williams will be working as **SENDCO** for the children in our mainstream classes for 3 days per week next year (as well as teaching Computing for the other two days). Alongside Miss Garwood-Stephenson, who is ARC Lead and SENDCO for the ARC, we hope this increased capacity will help us support the needs of all children in the school. Mrs White as Deputy Headteacher will continue to oversee SEND as well as other aspects of inclusion e.g. safeguarding, behaviour and attendance.

We will be moving to an **online booking and pre-payment system for wraparound care** (breakfast and after school club). Using this will mean that you can book your places and pay or schedule payments at the same time. The system will not allow you to book if you have any debt on your account, so it is very important that all due and overdue balances are cleared by mid-July 2025 at the very latest.

The contract for **school lunches and after school club teas** has been out to tender for all of the schools in our Trust and Mrs White and myself were involved in shortlisting and interviewing the companies. The Lunchtime Company were successful - we were all impressed with their menu variety, more fresh produce and positive references from other schools. They are a relatively small, local company who we think will work well in partnership with us and be responsive to feedback.

Yesterday, we had **30 new Chromebooks** arrive in school which have been provided by the trust. This is part of a trust-wide project to improve the digital literacy of our children by using technology to support learning. The project will start with Year 4 and the children in Year 3 had their first session with Andrew Goodgame, a certified Google and Apple educator, yesterday. He was really impressed by the skills they already have (thank you Miss Williams!) and their enthusiasm and behaviour. This will really complement the generous pledge from the PTA to support updating our technology for children to use.

We have two policies, **Anti-Bullying** and **Anti-Racism**, that are currently being written and revised to make sure all children feel safe, respected and that they belong in our school. Alongside these will be a series of lessons for children as well as further training for staff. Our Local Governing Body are supporting us and we will share this with you later in the term.

As in previous years, I would really love **feedback from yourselves** to help us shape our priorities (and hopefully let us know what we are doing well!). I am holding two **Headteacher coffee mornings** this term, similar to my previous Headteacher forums, which are an open discussion with a brief tour of the school included. These are on Friday 27<sup>th</sup> June and Friday 4<sup>th</sup> July at 9am.

Many of you have work and other time commitments, so you can share your thoughts with me on an **online form**. This one is for general feedback <u>General - Click Here</u> – what's working well, what has improved, what you would like to see changed – and this one <u>Communication and Engagement - Click here</u> is about how we can best communicate with you and involve you in the life of the school.

I know that this is a very busy time of year for families and can also be unsettling as we are about to transition to a new teacher, a new year (and for our Year 6 a new school). As I've been made aware of a few chat threads this week that have been hurtful about staff and children, I've repeated below how you can get help with any issue as well as our expectations of conduct as shared in September (including PTA events as well as use of What's App).

# **Communication and Working Together**

## Who to talk to in school – questions, concerns, support

Most conversations about your child will be with the **class teacher in the first instance**. If you need to contact the teacher you can speak with them directly on the playground at the start and end of day, call the office and a message will be passed on or email the class email address found on the year group pages <u>here</u>.

We also have a number of **senior staff** who have wider responsibilities in school, who are out on the playgrounds every day to speak with and they can also be contacted by calling/emailing the office.

### Polite Reminder – If there's a problem . . .

We do understand that when you are worried about your child or something that is happening in school it can be an emotional and difficult time for you as parents/carers.

Our staff are available to listen to you and to help as much as we can by working as partners together. On (thankfully) rare occasions, we have needed to remind parent/carers about our expectations of their communication and behaviour.


### We ask that you remember to:


- **never confront someone else's child about an issue** either on site or in the local area let school know what is worrying you and let us handle the problem.
- avoid conflict/confrontation with other parents/carers at school and school events –
  this makes children and the community feel unsafe. Staff are on hand to hear any
  concerns and often problems escalate when they are not reported to us in the first
  instance.
- **treat our staff politely and with respect** we may need to end conversations that are aggressive, demeaning or discriminatory. Please think carefully about the content and wording of emails sent to staff when you are upset.
- **be careful about what is posted on WhatsApp groups or similar** negative/personal comments about children, families or staff are rarely useful in resolving issues but often damage relationships

Ethan in Year 3 attended a football camp at half term where he was awarded the Player of the Week trophy, and his team won the entire tournament.




He showed great sportsmanship, helping the younger players and training really hard in all weather. Well done Ethan!




