Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

We have certainly started the Autumn 2 term with a bang! I had a very proud Headteacher moment on Tuesday morning as the children came back into school and by just after 9am we had engaging and exciting lessons up and running in all classrooms and all of our fabulous outdoor space being used with rugby on the field, hockey in the MUGA and Forest School in full swing. We continued to have a great week with visitors, sports matches, clubs and a theme day in Year 4 as you will see below.

Thank you to all of you who took the time to complete my survey before half term – your feedback is always helpful. A few questions about communications came up, so to clarify:

\circ Emails from school

We try to only use these for detailed communications, those that are specific to a class or year group or information that would not go in a public newsletter. We are aware that parents/carers can feel bombarded by emails so general information is in newsletters.

Medical Tracker

We notify you of accidents etc. that have needed first aid using medical tracker to ensure you have been informed (children do tend to lose paper letters/stickers). These are notifications for your awareness, they do not include all of the details of the accident.

Most medical /first aid needs are met in school and children are well enough to stay e.g. a small head bump you need to be aware of but is not affecting the child.

If a medical issue may need more attention, e.g. a head bump where a child is showing signs of concussion or a child isn't responding to their asthma plan, we will call you directly – please make sure we have at least 2 accurate numbers for emergencies.

\circ $\,$ Emails to school $\,$

The class email address will not be checked by teachers during the day. We do our best to be available for all parents/carers and aim to respond in a reasonable timeframe given the commitments of teachers and staff during a busy teaching day/week.

If you are reporting your child's absence, call the office or email

<u>attendance@churchfields.q1e.org.uk</u>. If you are changing who is picking up your child from the usual arrangement, please email the office <u>admin@churchfields.q1e.org.uk</u> before 2.30pm and they can pass the message on to the teacher/after school club.

• Newsletters

This is sent to you regularly throughout the year by email and is also posted on our school website <u>HERE</u>. The purpose of the newsletter is to share key information with the whole school (for example, upcoming dates are always on the first page and term dates are on the last page), community information that may be of interest and to celebrate what is happening at school and beyond.

PTA Classlist

This is optional for parents/carers to use to access PTA information, buy tickets etc. The school does not communicate directly through Classlist as not all families use this.

• WhatsApp (or similar)

You may choose to form or join groups for communications between families. The school does not use WhatsApp to communicate – our communications come directly from us in email or the newsletters. We don't monitor or participate in WhatsApp communications. These can be helpful communities but I would remind you that negative or personal comments about children, families or staff are rarely useful in resolving issues but often damage relationships.




Birthday Book Donations




